Tested Positive for COVID-19

When participating in our current all-staff testing program on Thursday, March 30, a full-time housekeeper had a negative result for COVID-19. At home on Friday, however, this employee began to experience symptoms associated with the virus and asked a healthcare provider to complete another test which yielded a positive outcome for COVID-19.

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This person, who works in our skilled nursing care and rehab community, will recuperate at home and only return to work in accordance with CDC standards. Please respect this individual's privacy.

We ask residents and employees, who may have symptoms or who have been exposed to someone with the virus, to ask the receptionist to schedule a test.
