
The Carville

When the Great Chicago Fire struck in 1871, all the Sisters of Mercy took refuge in Carville, a small town just south of the city. What was once Carville is today the intersection of 26th Street and South Michigan Avenue, the site of Mercy Hospital, Chicago's first chartered and oldest continually operating hospital. For the Sisters, Carville represented a much-needed place of safety so they could help others.

Over time, Mercy Hospital and Medical Center expanded and was completely rebuilt in 1967. In 2021, another organization assumed ownership and renamed it Insight Hospital and Medical Center Chicago.
