

Frances Xavier Warde, who in 1828 was the first to join Catherine McAuley in her ministry to serve the poorest of Dublin, was born at Bellbrook House in County Laois, Ireland. She was one of two companions with Catherine McAuley when they professed vows, thereby founding the Sisters of Mercy in 1831.

In 1843, Mother Warde and six young Sisters sailed to the United States. By her death in 1884, she had led the establishment of 82 Mercy ministries in 20 cities across nine states.

Bellbrook apartments are a tribute to the important first chapter in the expansion of Catherine McAuley's mission which has expanded to more than 30 countries.
