

Irish Classic benefits Mercy Circle

Mercy Circle recently held its inaugural Irish Classic golf tournament, raising \$75,000 to underwrite costs for refreshing the decor of Baggot Street, Mercy Circle's community for residents benefiting from memory-care support.

Eighty-eight golfers and an additional 50 dinner guests gathered at Ridge Country Club on Sept. 22. In addition to the tourney sponsors, their support made the Irish Classic the largest fundraiser in the history of Mercy Circle, according to Tom Ramsden, development director for the senior living community.

Mercy Circle Executive Director Frances Lachowicz said Mercy Circle opened in October 2013.

"Their generosity makes it possible for us to update the decor and replace flooring in this busy area of our community."
